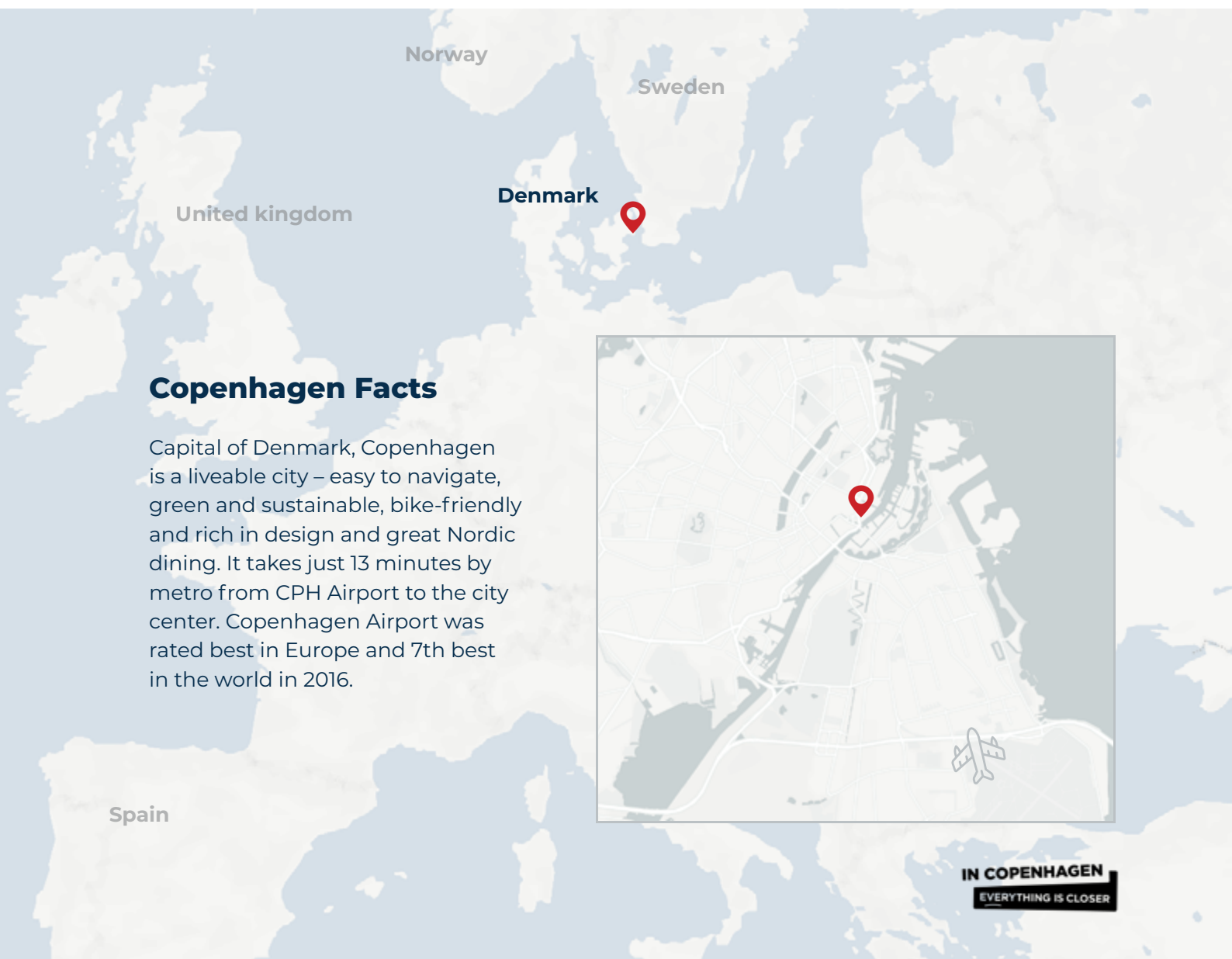
How to get here

Copenhagen Airport is Scandinavia's major hub and was ranked 'Best Airport in Northern Europe 2017' by SKYTRAX.

The travel time to the city centre by shuttle rail service and the 24-hour fully-automated metro is just 13 minutes. There are also direct rail links from the airport to many destinations in Denmark.

Going from A to B

Copenhagen is well-connected with fast and accessible 24-hour public transport. And you can always do as the Danes – hop on a bike. Regional and metropolitan trains also connect the Central Station and Nørreport Station with destinations in scenic North Zealand within an hour's travel.
